Remarks by Her Excellency Ellen Johnson Sirleaf President of the Republic of Liberia at the High Level Reception to Launch an Initiative in support of the Implementation of Agenda 2030 and the Sustainable Development Goals

Your Majesty Queen Silvia, Prime Minister Lofven, Excellences, Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is at pleasure to join this group of leaders from across the world to launch a call to action for the swift implementation of the 2030 agenda for sustainable development.

I applaud you Prime Minister Lofven for organizing this event, a timely initiative, which moves us from words to action.

The people around the world have spoken and it is their views, their priorities that form the axis of the 2030 Development Agenda. They must therefore be involved in the implementation. We must make use of the new digital age that allows the free flow of information throughout the world. We must embark on a data revolution that would us to truly assess achievements and challenges as well as lay the ground for planning for the next steps.

To conclude, let me say that Liberia is honored to be part of this global move and we will spare no efforts or energy to ensure that the hard work that went into the formulation of this agenda are translated into actions. The future of our planet, the prosperity of our people and the sustainability of our economies will depend on how strongly we work together, to achieve the ultimate goal of this agenda: eradicate poverty, put an end to inequalities and establish strong partnerships in a world where no one is left behind.
