Besides engaging in office work for the most part of the day, President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf drove to Clay Ashland outside Monrovia where she dedicated a modern cassava processing center in Korma.

The project under the theme: "Enhancing Food Security and Nutrition in and around Monrovia and Tubmanburg" was funded by the European Union and implemented by Welthungerhilfe (WHH), in partnership with ACF and RUAF. The estimated cost, including equipment, is put at US\$27,000.

President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf has praised the European Union for its continuous contribution to Liberia's recovery efforts.

The head of Cooperation at the European Union, Stefan Ellero, reiterated their commitment to the development of the country and thanked the Liberian leader for creating the enabling environment; adding, "Successful projects like this need to be implemented in different communities across Liberia."

In separate remarks, Clay Ashland's city mayor, Mrs. Alveria Morris-Raynes, town chief, J. Momo Johnson, and Korma's chairlady, Mrs. Sando Johnson said they were thankful to President Sirleaf and partners for affording them the opportunity to work and earn something; noting that they have raised over LD\$2 million through their village saving initiative.

According to an Executive Mansion release, the Liberian leader made the comments when she dedicated a modern cassava processing center in Kormah Town, Clay Ashland, Montserrado County on Friday, August 7, 2015.
