The Liberian leader visited the Robert International Airport (RIA) to inspect the three brand new electronic scanners installed there meant to detect elevated body temperature even if an individual is 10 meters away and numerous other physical conditions including fever.

The Temperature Electronic Scanners that have been installed at both the entry and departure terminals of the airport were provided by the Government of Japan to buttress government's efforts in containing the deadly Ebola virus.

President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf used the opportunity to inform journalists that the re-emergence of the new Ebola virus disease outbreak in lower Margibi County will be nip in the bud. "I am confident that the situation will be put under control," she asserted.
