➤ President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf today led an array of officials of the Government of Liberia to sign the Book of Condolence for the former Chief Justice of the Honorable Supreme Court of Liberia, His Honor Johnnie N. Lewis. The solemn and mournful ceremony took place on the first floor of the Temple of Justice.

Others who signed the Book were Vice President Joseph N. Boakai and Members of the Senate; Speaker Alex Tyler and Members of the House of Representatives; His Honor the Chief Justice Francis Korkpor and Associate Justices of the Supreme Court of Liberia and the National Bar Association; and former Heads of State and former Vice Heads of State of the Republic of Liberia.

Still others who signed the Book were the Doyen and Members of the Diplomatic Corps, Consular Corps, the Special Representative of the Secretary General of the UN Mission in Liberia and Head of International Organizations; the Clergy and Imams; other Officials of Government; Heads of Public Corporations, Autonomous Agencies, Bureaus and Commissions; and former Officials of Government.

On Tuesday, February 3, Heads of Political Parties, Heads of Civil Society Organizations and the General Public will sign the Book of Condolence. The Book remains opened till 12:00 noon.

The late Chief Justice Lewis died on Wednesday evening, January 21, in Monrovia en route to the John F. Kennedy Medical Center. He was 69 years old.

In a brief statement announcing his death on Thursday, January 22, President Sirleaf said the late Counselor served his country and the international community with extraordinary talent, intellect, knowledge and brilliance and urged all Liberians to grant him the respect he duly deserves.
