## HIGHLIGHTS OF THE PRESIDENT'S DAILY ACTIVITIES Tuesday, May 12, 2015

Having been officially declared Ebola free by the World Health Organization on Saturday, May 9, President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf joined the Ambassador of the People's Republic of China Zhang Yue to decommission the Chinese-built and managed 100-bed Ebola Treatment Unit (ETU) at the Samuel K. Doe (SKD) stadium in Paynesville. The facility was later turned over to the Liberian Government.

The 20-room Chinese ETU and its accessories which consists of more than 920,000 items including more than 1,500 kinds of medical instruments and materials is worth approximately US\$7 million.

At the same time, Liberia and the People's Republic of China broke grounds for the renovation of SKD stadium.

For the last six months, three batches of PLA military medical team of more than 350 medical staff worked in the facility. The Chinese ETU served a total of 177 patients at its triage and admitted 110 patients. They also treated 10 confirmed cases, among which six patients recovered.
