Highlights of President Sirleaf's Daily Activities Tuesday, July 8, 2014

- President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf met with the Dr. Elwood Dunn, Chair of the Constitution Review Committee (CRC). Currently, this committee is reviewing and seeking opinions and suggestions from Liberians from all walks of life including the Diaspora about the nation's national symbols, cultural orientations, Constitution and rights of persons.
- The Liberian leader later visited the compound of the John F. Kennedy Medical Center in the wake of the flooding which has affected the rear fence of the Compound.

There, she instructed the Ministry of Public Works to lead a team charged with the responsibility to clear all man-made structures obstructing the drainages and flow of water there. She stressed that urgent and immediate steps should be taken to avoid further destruction of the medical facility.

She frowned at the construction of structures in unapproved places as they are blocking free flow of water and causing floods in the streets, alleys, and communities some of which have threatened the J.F.K. Medical Center, which is the hub of Liberia's health care delivery efforts.

President Sirleaf also used the opportunity to thank the J.F.K. staff and public health workers for their dedication to duty, service to humanity, compassion, courage, as well as their sacrificial services to the nation terming them as being among the heroes on the frontline in helping to wipe out the Ebola virus from Liberia.

 Later in the afternoon, President Sirleaf held a meeting with the Vice President of Arcelor Mittal, Mr. Kleber de Silva on the violence at the company's facilities in Yekepa, Nimba County. The Minister of Lands, Mines and Energy, Mr. Patrick Sendolo attended the meeting.

Following the meeting with President Sirleaf, both Mr. Sendolo and de Silva addressed the press on how government and the company will proceed.
