President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf today met with Ambassador George Manneh Weah at which time she received his resignation letter as Liberia's Peace Ambassador.

Ambassador Weah, also the political leader of the opposition party, Congress for Democratic Change, said his resignation is consistent with the policy pronouncement by the Liberian President requesting all members of the Executive qualified by the National Elections Commission (NEC) to participate in the upcoming senatorial election to resign their posts. He has been qualified by the NEC to participate in the forthcoming Special Senatorial Elections scheduled for later this year.

During the meeting, Ambassador Weah thanked the Liberian leader for allowing him to serve as Peace Ambassador which enabled him to contribute to the promotion of peace and stability in the country. He promised to continue working for the promotion and sustenance of peace where ever he finds himself.

President Sirleaf, in response, thanked the former Peace Ambassador for his service and his immense contribution to the sustenance of peace and stability in Liberia. She encouraged him to continue to do whatever he can and in whatever capacity to promote peace and stability in the country. Ambassador Weah was appointed Liberia's Peace Ambassador in December 2012.
